The COURAGE, CAMINO, and CyberROAD consortia are pleased to invite you to the COURAGE-CAMINO-CyberROAD joint conference, which will take place in The Hague, on Thursday 10 (13h30-18h) and Friday 11 March (9h30-16h), 2016. The event is part of an overall thinking and exchange process that aims at promoting a European vision and roadmap for the fight against cybercrime and cyberterrorism, a priority for the European Union and the basis upon which all three projects were initiated.

The event will provide SMEs, the industry sector, scientific communities and end users with a forum to exchange ideas and challenges presented by the projects in order to elaborate strategies and priorities for a common roadmap to fight cybercrime and cyberterrorism.

In particular, the goal of the two-day event is to gather insights regarding cybercrime and cyberterrorism in Europe and beyond, and to discuss further developments in the methodology, technology, and foundations for the design and effective implementation of a European roadmap for the fight against cybercrime and cyberterrorism.

The outcome of the workshop will help towards the development of a consolidated roadmap between COURAGE, CAMINO, and CyberROAD which will be presented to the European Commission by mid-2016. This roadmap will aim to clarify the various interpretations, commonalities, and differences emanating from the European cybersecurity community as well as the results of the three projects, thereby paving the way for a more structured and well-founded approach to future roadmaps and initiatives in the fight against cybercrime and cyberterrorism, including research and technology, education and training, and standards.

ABOUT THE PROJECTS

COURAGE

COURAGE aims to produce a research agenda for Cybercrime and Cyberterrorism (CC/CT) using the expertise of the consortium partners, advisory board members and recruited expert stakeholders. The research agenda will identify the major challenges, reveal research gaps for Cybercrime and Cyberterrorism, and recommend practical research approaches to address these gaps through strategies that are aligned to real-world needs. These strategies will be supported by test and evaluation schemes. The purpose of COURAGE is to significantly improve the security of citizens and critical infrastructures and support crime investigators.

CAMINO

The major goal of CAMINO is to provide a realistic roadmap for improving resilience against cybercrime and cyber terrorism. Roadmap will address the following questions. Where should taxpayer money be invested for research purposes? What are the challenges? What approach should be taken to tackle these challenges? Once the possible solutions are found, how should the results be tested and evaluated to demonstrate effectiveness? The consortium uses a holistic approach, analysing functions and capabilities addressing technical and human issues which are inter-related with legal and ethical aspects. We follow so called CAMINO THOR approach where cyber security is perceived comprehensively in 4 dimensions: Technical, Human, Organisational, and Regulatory. In each of the dimensions some items are proposed for the roadmap.

CyberROAD

CyberROAD is aimed at identifying current and future issues in the fight against cybercrime and cyberterrorism in order to draw a strategic roadmap for cybersecurity research. A detailed snapshot of the technological, social, economic, political, and legal scenarios on which cybercrime and cyberterrorism are developed will first be provided. Then, cybercrime and cyberterrorism will be analysed in order to identify research gaps and priorities.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION

The event will take place at the International Press Centre in The Hague, Netherlands, on 10-11 March 2016. The International Press Centre is located centrally, a short 10-minute walk from The Hague central railway station (Den Haag CS) or one stop by tram.

How to get to the venue:

By plane:

[Schiphol Amsterdam Airport](#) is the main airport in the Netherlands. Check-in time is 2 hours. Direct train connections to The Hague Central Station (Den Haag CS) run at half-hourly intervals and the journey is about 30 minutes. Train tickets can be purchased from the main hall of the airport. Access to the train platforms also directly from the main hall of the airport. The conference venue is a short 10-minute walk from The Hague Central Station (Den Haag CS) or one stop by tram.

Rotterdam-The Hague Airport is a smaller airport serving mainly charter and budget flights to and from various European destinations. The best connection from the airport to The Hague is by [taxi](#). The taxi rank is in front of the airport; the journey to The Hague is about 20 minutes and a one-way fare varies between 33 and 50 EUR.

By train:

The Hague Central Station (in Dutch Den Haag CS) is the main railway station in The Hague and a 10-minute walk from the conference venue or one stop by tram.

By tram:

Tram stop Spui (one stop from railway station The Hague Central – Den Haag CS).

Tram lines 2, 3, 4, 6.
