The CAMINO and COuRAGE consortia are pleased to invite you to the **CAMINO-COURAGE joint workshop, which will take place in Montpellier, on 8th (14h-18h) and 9th of April (9h-16h), 2015.**

The CAMINO workshop, organised in partnership with COuRAGE, is part of an overall thinking and exchange process that aims at promoting a European vision of cybersecurity and strengthening the fight against cybercrime, a priority for the European Union for which both projects have been developed.

The workshop will provide SMEs, the industry sector, scientific communities and end users a forum for exchanging CAMINO and COURAGE projects visions and challenges and elaborating strategies to achieve these goals.

In particular, the goal of the two days-workshop is to gather insights regarding Cyber Security in Europe and beyond, and to discuss further developments in methodology, technology, and foundations for the design and effective implementation of Cyber Security, that enable the realization of recommendations towards the European Commission and a fortiori to European citizens.

The outcome of the workshop will thus help towards the clarification of the various interpretations, commonalities, and differences, thereby paving the way for a more structured and well-founded approach to future roadmaps and initiatives in the fight against cybercrime and cyberterrorism, including research and technology, education and training, and standards.

The CAMINO-COURAGE workshop will gather experts in the fight against cybercrime and cyberterrorism. Representatives from academia, industry and policy makers, and end users are invited to take part of this event.

The two-days workshop will be led by:

- Keynote speeches organized in 5 sessions, chaired by cybersecurity experts (from European and national institutions, academia...), on topics related to:
 - Digital innovations, cybercrime and cyberterrorism
 - Analysis of risks and strategies of cyberthreats
 - The development of virtual currencies
 - Big data, Internet of things and Security
 - European projects, International cooperation, research and training in the fight against cybercrime and cyberterrorism
- Presentations of the first outcomes from both CAMINO and COURAGE projects.

ABOUT CAMINO PROJECT:

CAMINO is the Coordination and Support Action titled "**Comprehensive Approach to cyber roadMap coordINation and develOpment**", a European research project in the security domain "Developing a Cyber crime and cyber terrorism research agenda" funded by the European Union's 7th Framework Programme. The two-year project started on April 1st, 2014. The CAMINO Consortium comprises ten partners from eight European countries: ITTI Sp. z o.o. and Police academy from Poland; Everis Aeroespacial y Defensa S.L. and S21SEC Information Security Labs S.L. from Spain; Sec-Control Finland Ltd. from Finland; DFRC AG from Switzerland; Espion Ltd. from Ireland; CBRNE Ltd. from the UK; The National Research Council CNR from Italy, and University of Montpellier from France. There are also 22 supporting members. CAMINO is led by ITTI, and is coordinated by Dr. Michał Choraś.

The CAMINO main strategic objectives are to develop a comprehensive cybercrime and cyber terrorism research agenda, and to initiate long-term activities with the aim to provide a stable EU platform of security research experts and organisations.

CAMINO will prepare the guidelines, its professional community's recommendations and a comprehensive research roadmap for the European Commission regarding fighting cybercrime and cyber terrorism. CAMINO is offering a long-term EU cyber research platform with the cyber security "think tank". CAMINO is already strongly linked to the EU Integrated Mission Group for Security (IMG-S) Cyber Security Thematic Area (TA7).

Some information about Montpellier

At the heart of the Mediterranean arc, Montpellier is the capital of the department of Hérault and the Languedoc-Roussillon region. The South of France city, built by well-known international architects, is rich of its 1000 years of historical treasures. For instance, Montpellier mothers the oldest (XIVth century) Medical University of the Western world still in operation.

The historical centre, *l'Ecusson*, is famous for its beautiful mansions and medieval streets. Among the must-see places in Montpellier also feature the *Place de la Comédie*, one of the largest pedestrian areas in Europe, the Musée Fabre renowned for its rich art collections, the triumphal arch built in 1692, the Peyrou promenade, the Antigone district designed by Ricardo Bofill in the 1980s, the Lez River shores and the Montpellier zoo.

150km away from Marseille, at the crossroads of Spain and Italy, the city of Montpellier is served by an international airport 8km from the city center and a train station 100m from the *Place de la Comédie*. A





friendly and welcoming city, sitting between the sea and mountains, and gifted with a rich arts and culinary tradition, Montpellier has everything to turn this workshop into an unforgettable event.

How to get to Montpellier:

By plane : Montpellier Méditerranée Airport (10 min from Montpellier centre, frequent and cheap connections between the airport and Montpellier centre)

Or Paris Airport, then train to Montpellier St-Roch

Or Marseille Airport (150km), then train to Montpellier St-Roch

If landing at Marseille Provence Airport:

Train: take a shuttle bus from Marseille airport to Marseille Saint Charles train station (travel duration: 20-25min). Then take a train to Montpellier (arrival in Montpellier centre) (travel duration: 1h15-1h30).

Car rental: several car rental companies are represented at the airport. It is an easy 150 km (1h30) drive to get to Montpellier from Marseille airport.

By train : Montpellier Saint Roch train station

At the heart of the Mediterranean arc, in the Europe-Spain axis, the Montpellier St-Roch train station is particularly well served. From Paris, it is a 3 hours and 20 minutes comfortable trip to Montpellier. There is a direct connection from Paris Roissy-Charles de Gaulle airport (4h).

By tram : « Port Marianne » or « Rives du Lez » station

By foot : 20 min-walk from the Montpellier Saint Roch train station

By car : Montpellier is easy to reach by motorways A75 from the northwest and A9 from the northeast and southwest. **Exit Est (29)** allows you to access the workshop venue, the historical centre, Montpellier Tourist Office, Corum Conference Center, Odysseum leisure and shopping center, and the Montpellier Exposition Park.

Several paid parking spaces are available around the workshop venue. It is recommended to leave the car at the hotel and use public transportation.

Be aware : if travelling on April 6th, 2015, it is Easter Monday (holiday) in France.
